Participating in Conservation Explorers gives you an opportunity to continue your exploration of the natural world while learning about the benefits of natural area stewardship.

Conservation Explorers is offered to current 8th grade students throughout Lake County.

Program dates: Monday, July 22 – Wednesday, August 7.

This includes a seven day trip to northern Michigan (July 28 – August 3). Students must commit to the entire program in order to attend.

To apply to the Conservation Explorers Program you must submit:

1. A completed Program Application Form, signed by you and your parent/guardian.
2. A completed Student Agreement Form, signed by you and your parent/guardian.
3. A completed Recommendation Form, preferably from a science teacher or community leader (pastor, youth group leader, etc.) who knows you well and is not related to you.
4. A copy of your Report Card from 2nd quarter (January) OR the most recent one you have.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE POSTMARKED OR RECEIVED BY Friday, April 5.

Preference is given to those students who submit their applications early.

What is Conservation Explorers?

Conservation Explorers is a conservation and environmentally based outdoor summer program for current 8th grade students. It is co-sponsored by the Lake County Forest Preserves and Lake Forest Open

Lands Association's Center for Conservation Leadership. The goal of this program is to increase students' knowledge and appreciation of the role conservation and stewardship play in the environment.

Focusing on water, wildlife and way of life, students get to know the various eco-systems in Lake County and understand the importance of conservation efforts to study and protect these unique areas. We learn how to care for them and the work that goes into conserving them. Our trip to Michigan will give us the opportunity to explore another lake ecosystem and compare it to our county.

Program Schedule:

July 22 – July 26: 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Students meet at a variety of places during the first week of the program.

Transportation to these places is provided. A school bus route with stops at several schools provides transportation starting as early as 7:30 a.m. for arrival by 9:00 a.m. and brings the students home, leaving the site at 3:00 p.m. each day. Students may also provide their own transportation to the sites.

July 28 – August 3: Field trip to Michigan's Leelanau Peninsula

Leaving the Greenbelt Cultural Center at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, July 28, Conservation Explorers travel across Lake Michigan to the eastern shore of our great lake. While in Michigan, we participate in citizen science and explore the spectacular Sleeping Bear National Lakeshore, canoe the Boardman River and sail on a schooner.

August 5 – 7: 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

We continue our conservation education in Lake County, using the skills we learned in Michigan to better understand our local environment.

Who can participate?

- Eligible students are current Lake County 8th graders, entering 9th grade in fall, 2019.
- Students and parents must commit to the entire program and agree to provide their own transportation to our daily bus pickup
- There is no supervision at these school bus stops. The bus schedule will be available at Parent Information Meeting.
- The schedule for daily site visits will be available at the Parent Information Meeting.

The Michigan Trip Facts

- We will travel by ferry and vans.
- We will stay in Sutton's Bay, Michigan at the Inland Seas Educational Center.
- Students are housed in dorm rooms separated by gender.
- The *What to Bring* list will be discussed at the Parent Information Meeting.
- To maximize the experience, cell phones will not be allowed on the trip.
